Annual Report

2018

The citizens of Holmes County and visitors have started to see an improved difference in the condition of our County roads over the past two years. We have had numerous positive calls and comments since the voters of Holmes County voted in favor "to make our roads better" by supporting the ½% road sales tax. This is often unusual for a public office to receive these types of positive comments; however, it is very much appreciated.

At this point in time we have two years of work completed. In 2017 we improved 28.01 miles of roadway, and in 2018 we improved 30.997 miles of roadway. This year we have 26.59 miles planned, although we are going to need to add some additional roads, due to damage from the winter.

After much planning and debate, the roads we will be improving are; CR203 (4.22 mi.), CR207 (5.23 mi.), CR22 (9.27 mi.), CR22A (0.03 mi.), CR23 (3.07 mi.). CR220 (0.09 mi.), CR230 (0.68 mi.), CR50 (4.01 mi.) for a total of 26.59 miles.

The additional roads to be improved due to the rough winter will be CR145, CR53 and CR201 (North of 241). We would also like to pave the southern half of CR201 (from SR39 to SR241) if the funds are available.

Governor Dewine and the State Legislators have passed an increase in the motor fuel tax rate for Ohio that will begin in July. The only thing that concerns me, at this point, is possible inflation of the construction costs of these contracted projects throughout the State, which might affect us in Holmes County.

It is my intention to add this additional funding to the currently 1/4% road sales tax- 10 year planned rotation and make it a 7 year planned rotation. In addition to these contracted paving projects, we will start on some much needed safety projects throughout the County. For example, the CR203/TR351 and CR77/CR207 Intersection Safety Projects. These projects will make these dangerous intersections safer for the traveling public and the citizens of Holmes County.

Ditching!! Water is our enemy. Now that we have our paving on an acceptable schedule we need to concentrate on ditching. We can have the best roadway out there, but it will not last if water in our roadside ditches can't flow correctly to get the moisture away. With this said, we are looking at better ways and more efficient ways of maintaining our roadside ditches. With our new and improved roadways, the old way of ditching with a grader is unacceptable. The grader method is ok for cutting the berms, however it is not optimal for cleaning the ditches. The grader method is causing some damage to the roadway edges and the ditch cross section we get with the grader is not what it needs to be. We are going to study what else is out there that will get the most cost effective and efficient ditch maintenance operations.

Holmes County is a wonderful place to live and work!!





Melway Paving was awarded the project as the lowest and best qualified bidder, and performed the work at a cost of \$2,730,552.11. The Holmes County Highway Department performed the preparation work, such as grinding on the roads that were to be resurfaced. The cost of the grinding was \$131,150.33. These preparation costs were from local funding, and include equipment, labor, and material. The total overall cost of the project was \$2,861,702.44.

The total cost of the project includes; reclaiming, resurfacing, and berming. To allow the resurfacing project to commence at an appropriate time, \$1,922,346.00 of the project costs were financed through an OPWC loan, which will be reimbursed as the 0.25% sales tax fund increases. The remaining cost of the project was paid from the 0.25% sales tax funds that were available.
